The festivities kicked off with a traditional concert by colonial balladeer, Linda Russell. In quaint Dutch tradition, visitors fed St. Nick's faithful horse carrots and hay. Children got to sign the giant guest Red Book before being enthralled by St. Nick's tale of *The Baker's Dozen*.

Visitors tried their hands at colonial games; they created holiday pomanders; decorated a Dutch clog with *Sinterklaas* themes and, finally, dressed a tree for the sundown tree-lighting ceremony that closed the day.
